### **4-H CROSS COUNTY LINES POLICY**

Kenton County 4-H Council will address cross county lines concerns for the 2023-2024 program year during their regular November 20 meeting. All requests to exit or enter a program must be received in writing and turned in to Diane Kelley, at 10990 Marshall Road Location by 4:30p.m. on 11/20/2023. As a general rule, a young person becomes a 4-H member within the county where he/she is a resident or attends school. Participation close to home usually allows the young person and his/her family to become more fully engaged in 4-H and more actively involved in the greater community.

Generally, where a young person participates in 4-H becomes an issue when competition is involved; where a young person is a member becomes important to fair and ethical competition. It is assumed that a young person is a member of 4-H in the county of residence or county where the young person attends school. To compete as part of any other county's 4-H program, a transfer of membership must be clearly established through a request by the member, approval by the agents and councils involved and appropriate documentation. Determination of whether a young person may cross a county line is to be completed on a case by case basis by the agents and councils involved.

## Kentucky 4-H Livestock Volunteer Certification Program

4-H livestock and horse programs/projects may seem to be about animals, but in reality they are about youth. Young people are important to us and we want to make sure that we provide the very best educational experience that we can. For most, animal and animal-related programs/projects will provide a wide variety of life lessons, which will positively impact them for the rest of their lives, no matter what career path they choose to follow. For a few, an animal science project will lead to a career. While it is important for youth in livestock programs/projects to gain a basic understanding of animal anatomy, daily care, nutrition, reproduction, and marketing, it's the learning from hands-on experience—making decisions, then seeing the results, and accepting responsibility for the care of a living animal—where lives of youth are forever changed.

#### **Guidelines Related to Instruction**

What instruction qualifies towards a youth's hours of instruction? Many of the lesson plans that are a part of the livestock curricula include the opportunity for various resource people to present programs and workshops. Each county's CVL(s) and the County 4-H Youth Development Agent determine at the beginning of the 4-H program year the educational programs/topics that will be offered, and the individuals that will conduct the instruction.

Below are examples of educational opportunities, which might qualify toward a youth's six hour educational requirement. This is not an all inclusive list, and is provided as examples only:

#### a. Lessons/learning activities taught by the CVL(s).

b. Lessons/learning activities taught by Extension specialists, associates, or agents as part of the series of educational activities planned by the CVL(s) and the County 4-H Youth Development Agent.

c. Lessons/learning activities taught by "experts" (such as Vocational Agriculture Teachers, veterinarians, allied industry personnel, and past 4-H members who are highly skilled in field, etc.) as part of the series of educational activities planned by the CVL(s) and the County 4-H Youth Development Agent.

# 2023-2024 Livestock Educational Dates

If you would like to participate in showing livestock, beef, sheep, swine, dairy, goats or country ham, livestock judging, or livestock skillathon next spring and summer, the educational meetings will have to be completed <u>before</u> your animal is KUIP tagged, or you register for activities. Each 4-H member of any species or participating livestock activity must attend 6 hours of training conducted by 4-H certified volunteers in order to participate in any livestock activity. **Please sign up via the Kenton County Extension Office PACE system.**

# 4-H ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM - DUE NOVEMBER 20

- Cumulative program spans the entire 4-H career.
- Awards points for outside efforts and interests.
- Encourages growth and development by awarding high points at multi-county, state, and national levels.
- Does not require a previous level of achievement to apply for a higher level as long as the 4-H'er meets the minimum point requirements.
- 4-H'ers can choose to compete for awards and prizes (i.e. Bronze, Silver, Gold, and Emerald) OR simply achieve levels and be recognized in their counties.
- Youth who have obtained a "Bronze", "Silver", or "Gold" retain their title.
- The Achievement Program includes and incorporates the previous "Middle School Leadership Awards".
- Previous work completed by the 4-H'er (from past years) may be included in the Achievement Program.

The program is designed to allow 4-H'ers to begin keeping records of their awards, participation, and projects.



## THIS MONTH'S TOPIC: WHY SHOULD I GO TO THE DOCTOR WHEN I AM NOT SICK?

It is important to go to the doctor when you are sick. But there are also reasons to visit the doctor when you are well. Having a doctor or nurse check for signs of being sick before you start to feel bad is important. This allows a doctor to find problems earlier when they are easier to fix. You can get or stay healthy faster.



If you play sports, you may need to get a sport's physical. A sports physical is a visit to the doctor to make sure it is safe to play the sport you want to play. Sports physicals and well visits to the doctor are not just for kids. Grown-ups should also go to the doctor once a year for a well exam to stay healthy.

A well-child exam or sports physical usually include several different parts: a paper to fill out ahead of time, questions from a nurse or doctor, and a physical exam. You should fill out any paper with your parent or guardian, to make sure you have the right answers. As you get older, you need to know the answers to questions about your medical history, so this is a great way to learn.

#### Your medical history includes questions about:

- any medical problems, illnesses, and injuries you had when you were younger
- medicines or vitamins you take
- medical problems that run in your family

During the physical exam, a nurse or doctor will measure how tall you are, check how much you weigh, check your blood pressure, listen to your heart and lungs, and look at your muscles, bones, and joints. You may also take a vision, hearing, or breathing screening. These screenings do not hurt. It is important that you pay attention and follow directions so the screening shows how well your body is working.

This visit is also your chance to ask questions about your growing body and how you can help stay healthy. Before your visit, try writing any questions down that you have for the doctor, and then write down the doctor's answer. You may feel silly at first, but you will remember more and you will make the most out of your visit.

Remember, doctors and health-care visits are good for you, even when you are not sick. They may not be the most fun, but well visits and physicals are an important part of keeping your body on track and healthy.


