### LIVESTOCK VALIDATION CHECKLIST-2023

**Exhibitor** orders tags from: https://kystatefair.org/participate/submit-dna/ agents/advisors will **NOT** order tags. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to order K.U.I.P. tags.

**Exhibitor** will pay for tags at checkout. Exhibitor name(s), address, phone number, and email must be completed in order for tags to be shipped. K.U.I.P. tags will be issued to the exhibitor who ordered the K.U.I.P. tag and shall not be sold, traded or otherwise transferred to another exhibitor or animal.

> Entry Office will send tags, DNA kits, and informational paperwork to Exhibitor.

Exhibitor will follow tagging process to ensure market animal(s) are tagged with a KUIP tag and DNA has been pulled to send back in DNA Envelope.

- Place 840 EID Tag (KUIP tag) in center of animal's ear. Market Cattle tags are Y-Tex tags, Small Animal tags are AllFlex. Please note this as taggers for these two tags are **NOT** universal.
- Fill out DNA envelope completely
- Packets WILL NOT be accepted without exhibitor's and parent/guardian signatures
- Pull 40 hair follicles. **DO NOT CUT HAIR.**
- Supplies needed: pliers and collection envelope

Exhibitor will submit ONLINE Market Animal Validation Form for each Market Animal. Form can be found at "KY DNA" tab at kystatefair.org/livestock-validation-form/

**BOTH** the Market Animal Validation Form **AND** the DNA ENVELOPE for **EACH** animal must be submitted or postmarked before posted deadline. (Strongly suggest—hand delivery & obtain receipt or certified mail)

EACH Exhibitor will need to fill out an Online Market Animal Validation Form, even if the exhibitors are co-tagging.



# **Guidelines for 4-H Fair Project Entries at Kenton County Fair**

# Directions to Enter 4-H Projects for the Kenton County Fair

- All 4-H youth (age 9-18) that want to enter projects must turn in Record Book by 4:30 p.m. on June 30 to the Marshall Road or Kenton Lands Office and register that record book on line at: kentoncountyfairentry.com.
- All 4-H Fair Building projects must be entered online in the Fair Entry system at: kentoncountyfairentry.com by <u>4:30 p.m. on June 30.</u> After you have registered your projects, email mary.cannon@uky.edu and she will email your fair tags. If you do not have the resources to print your tags at home, please let Mary know and she will mail them to you.
- Social Security numbers will be required. Only the fair administrator can see this number and it will only be used for State Fair winners.
- Our office will be happy to help you learn the online system by appointment only. We will be taking appointments beginning on May 17.
- Youth must enter all projects online by 4:30 p.m. on June 30.
- Sunday, July 9th is a drop off day only. You will bring your projects to be judged. You must register your projects ahead of time and have the proper tags on them when you arrive.
- You WILL NOT be able to enter your projects into the Fair Entry system on drop off day, July 9th if you don't enter them by 4:30 p.m. on June 30.

You can log on to kentoncounty.fairentry.com from your computer or any mobile device to submit your entries to the fair. Online entries will be required for all exhibitors.

# The deadline for entries & record books will be 4:30 p.m. on June 30.

# Fair Tags will be printed and can be picked up at the Marshall Road Office on July 5-7 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

R ecord Books, cover sheets and scoring guidelines are available in the Kenton County Extension Office lobby. Junior books are light green colored, senior books are ivory.

#### Record Book Requirements

In order to enter projects at the Kenton County Fair, you <u>must</u> meet the following record book requirements:

1) Complete a Building and Companion animal record book and/or Market Animal record book.

2) All record books must be logged in by a secretary, agent or record book committee volunteer **before 4:30 p.m. on Friday, June 30, 2023 and entered into the online fair system at kentoncountyfairentry.com.** As always, record books will be accepted during office hours in the weeks prior to the deadline.

3) Your record book <u>must</u> score 7 or more points.

4) You <u>must</u> include a project achievement story. Reminder: the stories must be the child's original work.

5) Record books are on the website at: www.kentoncountyextension.com

6) Be sure to include your record book(s) when you enter other projects in the Fair Entry system.

#### IFAL Institute for Ag. Leaders

Those completing their junior year in 2023 and are among the top, well-rounded students in their class are eligible to attend IFAL. #### 4-H Natural Resources and Environmental Sciences Academy

The NRESci Academy is a three-year Program designed to teach youth about their natural environment. Scholars participate in hands-on investigations to learn about Kentucky's water, forest and wildlife.

The Academy is a three-year commitment, and meets quarterly each year. Scholars attend a 3-day residential retreat at Feltner 4-H Camp in Sept. and participate in three 1-day events held in winter, spring, and summer.

Applicants must be in the 5th grade at the time of the application. If selected, you must agree to make a 3-year commitment to the program.

# 4-H Cross County Lines Policy

Kenton County 4-H Council will address cross county lines concerns for the 2022-2023 program year during their regular April meeting. All requests to exit or enter a program must be received in writing and turned in to the Extension Office by 4:30 on 4/17/2023. As a general rule, a young person becomes a 4-H member within the county where he/she is a resident or attends school. Participation close to home usually allows the young person and his/her family to become more fully engaged in 4-H and more actively involved in the greater community. Generally, where a young person participates in 4-H becomes an issue when competition is involved; where a young person is a member becomes important to fair and ethical competition. It is assumed that a young person is a member of 4-H in the county of residence or county where the young person attends school. To compete as part of any other county's 4-H program, a transfer of membership must be clearly established through a request by the member, approval by the agents and councils involved and appropriate documentation. Determination of whether a young person may cross a county line is to be completed on a case by case basis by the agents and councils involved. Please keep in mind other county 4-H councils may not meet before the deadline to approve requests. Please submit appropriate forms as soon as possible.
