State Horse Updates

The State Horse Show is scheduled for August 5-10, 2024 at the Kentucky State Fairgrounds.

The State Horse Contests will be June 6 & 7—Martin Gatton College of Agriculture

The Qualification system for the 2024 State Show will be same as for 2023, which is to attend a horse show or horsemanship clinic, and provide proof to your leader/agent.

The Educational hours deadline is June 5.

Horse Eligibility Form deadline is June 20.

Multiple horses can be used in shows. All horses need to qualify and have correct paperwork on file.

STATE HORSE FORMS-June 20

Online forms are due on June 20. It is each 4-H'ers responsibility to make sure these forms are completed. Youth must participate in a local show or horse camp in order to participate in the state contest. Six education hours required. Check with your horse club leader for more information.



Record Books and scoring guidelines are available in the Kenton County Extension Office lobby. Junior books are light green colored, senior books are ivory.

Record Book Requirements

In order to enter projects at the Kenton County Fair, you <u>must</u> meet the following record book requirements:

- 1) Complete a Building and Companion animal record book and/or Market Animal record book.
- 2) All record books must be logged in by a secretary, agent, or record book committee volunteer **before 4:30** p.m. on Monday, July 8, 2024 and entered into the online fair system at kentoncountyfairentry.com. As always, record books will be accepted during office hours in the weeks prior to the deadline.
- 3) Your record book must score 7 or more points.
- 4) You must include a project achievement story. Reminder: the stories must be the child's original work.
- 5) Record books are on the website at: www.kentoncountyextension.com




2024 Bee Essay Contest

4-H Cross County Lines Policy

Kenton County 4-H Council will address cross county lines concerns for the 2023-2024 program year during their regular April meeting. All requests to exit or enter a program must be received in writing and turned in to the Extension Office by 4:30 on 4/15/2024. As a general rule, a young person becomes a 4-H member within the county where he/she is a resident or attends school. Participation close to home usually allows the young person and his/her family to become more fully engaged in 4-H and more actively involved in the greater community. Generally, where a young person participates in 4-H becomes an issue when competition is involved; where a young person is a member becomes important to fair and ethical competition. It is assumed that a young person is a member of 4-H in the county of residence or county where the young person attends school. To compete as part of any other county's 4-H program, a transfer of membership must be clearly established through a request by the member, approval by the agents and councils involved and appropriate documentation. Determination of whether a young person may cross a county line is to be completed on a case by case basis by the agents and councils involved. Please keep in mind other county 4-H councils may not meet before the deadline to approve requests. Please submit appropriate forms as soon as possible.

THIS MONTH'S TOPIC

WATCH OUT FOR EYE INJURIES

Your eyes are very small part of your body. But they perform a BIG job — helping you see! Do you know how to keep your eyes healthy? Taking care of your eyes includes being active, eating a lot of different fruits and vegetables, washing your hands before putting them near your eyes, and wearing goggles or glasses during sports or science class. Wearing sunglasses when you're outside also protects your eyes. Your doctor will check your eyesight from time to time to make sure you can see well. You might also visit an eye doctor, called an optometrist or ophthalmologist.



Sometimes, you can still have an accident, even when you are trying to be careful. Do you know what to do if your eye gets hurt or you get something in it?

It is important for you to learn what to do if your eye gets hurt, so you can act fast and get help. Anytime you or someone else gets hurt, the first thing to do is find an adult who can help. An adult can help decide if an injury is serious enough to go to the doctor or if you can treat it at home.

A common eye injury in kids is getting hit in the eye with a rock, ball, or someone's elbow. If it is your eye socket (the area around your eye) that is hurt, put something cold on the whole eye area for 15 minutes to help the pain and swelling go down.

It is also common to get tiny bits, like dust or sand, in your eye. It can hurt and make you want to rub your eyes to get it out. Instead, wash your eyes out with water. Splash water into your eyes several times to try to get all the dirt out. You might have to wash your eye out more than once. It might be several more minutes before your eye starts to feel better.

If you ever get chemicals in your eye, like a cleaner, battery acid, or ingredient from a science experiment,



wash your eye out right away. Tell an adult. In this case, you need to go to a doctor to make sure your eyeball, eyelid, and socket are all OK. They may also give you eye drops to help.

If an object like a stick or pencil gets stuck in your eye, do not pull it out. Do not put any pressure on the object because it might go in further. An adult will need to take you to the doctor right away for help getting it out and not doing more damage to your eye.

Your eyesight is important to protect! Knowing what to do in case of an eye injury can help you be prepared and keep safety in sight.



Guidelines for 4-H Fair Project Entries at Kenton County Fair

Directions to Enter 4-H Projects for the Kenton County Fair

- All 4-H youth (age 9-18) who want to enter projects must turn in Record Book by 4:30 p.m. on July 8 to the Marshall Road or Kenton Lands Office and register the record book online at: kentoncountyfairentry.com.
- All 4-H Fair Building projects must be entered online in the Fair Entry system at: kentoncountyfairentry.com by
 4:30 p.m. on July 8. After you have registered your projects, email mary.cannon@uky.edu and she will print
 your fair tags.
- Social Security numbers will be required. Only the fair administrator can see this number and it will only be used for State Fair participants.
- Our office will be happy to help you learn the online system by appointment only.
- Youth must enter all projects online by 4:30 p.m. on July 8.
- Sunday, July 14th is a drop off day only. You will bring your projects to be judged. You must register your projects ahead of time and have the proper tags on them when you arrive on July 14th.
- You WILL NOT be able to enter your projects into the Fair Entry system on drop off day, July 14th if you don't enter them by 4:30 p.m. on July 8.

You can log on to kentoncounty.fairentry.com from your computer or any mobile device to submit your entries for the fair. Online entries will be required for all exhibitors.

The deadline for entries & record books will be 4:30 p.m. on July 8.

Fair Tags will be printed and can be picked up at the Marshall Road Office on July 10-12 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
