# 4-H Natural Resources and Environmental Sciences Academy

The NRESci Academy is a three-year Program designed to teach youth about their natural environment. Scholars participate in hands-on investigations to learn about Kentucky's water, forest and wildlife.

The Academy is a three-year commitment, and meets quarterly each year. Scholars attend a 3-day residential retreat at Feltner 4-H Camp in Sept. and participate in three 1-day events held in winter, spring, and summer.

# **Record Book Requirements**

To enter projects at the Kenton County Fair, you must meet these record book requirements:

1) Complete a Building/Companion Animal record book and/or Market Animal record book.

2) All record books must be logged in by a secretary, agent, or record book committee volunteer before 4:30 p.m. on Monday, July 7, 2025 and entered into the online fair system at kentoncounty.fairentry.com. As always, record books will be accepted during office hours in the weeks prior to the deadline.

3) You must include a project achievement story. Reminder: the stories must be the child's original work.

5) Be sure to include your record book(s) when you enter other projects in the Fair Entry system.

### **4-H Recognition Points Log -**Due September 4, 2025

The Kenton County 4-H Recognition Points Log is a system for each 4-H'er to record everything they've done throughout the program year. A designated number of points are awarded for a variety of activities.

These logs are used to determine the outstanding boy and girl award that is presented each year at the 4-H Recognition Banguet. They are also helpful when applying for 4-H Achievement Forms. The 4-H Recognition Points Logs are available at the Extension Office in the fover next to the record books.

Recognition Points Logs for the 2024-2025 year will cover from September 1, 2024, through August 31, 2025. All Recognition Points Logs are due to the Extension Office by 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, September 4, 2025.

### 4-H Record Books - July 7, 2025 Deadline

All record books must be logged in by a secretary, agent or record book committee volunteer before 4:30 p.m. on Monday, July 7, 2025. Record books will be accepted at the Kenton County Extension Office, 10990 Marshall Road. As always, record books will be accepted during office hours in the weeks prior to the deadline.

### Directions to Enter 4-H/OPEN Projects for the Kenton County Fair

- All 4-H youth (age 9-18) who want to enter projects must turn in Record Book by 4:30 p.m. on July 7 to the Marshall Road or Kenton Lands Office and register the record book online at: kentoncounty.fairentry.com.
- All 4-H Fair Building projects AND Open Building Projects must be entered online in the Fair Entry system at: kentoncounty.fairentry.com by 4:30 p.m. on July 7. After you have registered your projects, email mary.cannon@uky.edu and she will print your fair tags.
- Social Security numbers will be required. Only the fair administrator can see this number and it will only be used for State Fair participants.
- Our office will be happy to help you learn the online system by appointment only.
- Youth must enter all projects online by 4:30 p.m. on July 7.
- Sunday, July 13th is a drop off day only. You will bring your projects to be judged. You must register your projects ahead of time and have the proper tags on them when you arrive on July 13th.
- You WILL NOT be able to enter your projects into the Fair Entry system on drop off day, July 13th if you don't enter them by 4:30 p.m. on July 7.

### **OPEN BUILDING is also requiring online entries this year!**

Log on to kentoncounty.fairentry.com from your computer or any mobile device to submit your entries for the fair. Online entries will be required for all exhibitors. The deadline for entries & record books will be 4:30 p.m. on July 7.

Fair Tags will be printed and can be picked up at the Marshall Road Office on July 9-11 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

## Apple Cranberry Waldorf Salad - 8 (1 cup servings)

#### Ingredients:

- 1 cup chopped Granny Smith apple
- 1 cup chopped Red Delicious apple
- 1 cup diced celery
- 1 cup halved seedless green grapes
- 1 cup halved seedless red grapes

### 1½ cups dried cranberries

- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
- 8 ounces non-fat vanilla yogurt
- 2 tablespoons honey
- 1⁄4 teaspoon cinnamon



#### Directions:

- 1. Combine chopped apples and diced celery and put in a medium sized bowl. Add grapes, cranberries, and walnuts to the mixture. Stir ingredients together.
- 2. In a separate bowl, add the yogurt, honey, and cinnamon. Stir together and pour over the fruit mixture. Cover and chill before serving.
