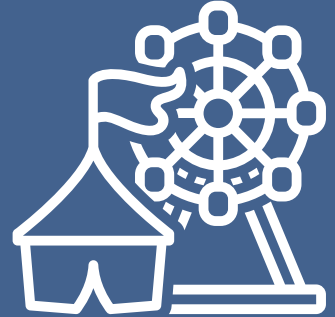

**4-H'er - Showcase your projects
at the Kenton County Fair!
Items will be on display all week!**

4-H projects are awarded ribbons based on the "Danish System." This is a judging system where the project is not compared to others in its class but to an ideal standard. Youth are awarded a blue, red or white ribbon based on how close the project approaches the standard. The best entry in the class is considered the champion and receives a purple ribbon and is eligible for the state fair.

Please note: Energy, Weather, County Only Sewing and Miscellaneous categories are county only, and do not advance to the state fair. Therefore, no purple or champion ribbons will be awarded in these categories.

Project Drop Off:

Sunday, July 13, 2025; 1-3 pm

Drop off project between 1 to 3 p.m. on Sunday, July 13th. The 4-H Building is the first building on your right as you walk up hill from the parking area. Stop at the check in table set at the building's entrance.

This is drop off only, you must register your projects on line by Monday, July 7. You will then go to the appropriate area for each project. Judging will occur following check in. If you cannot make the Sunday drop off, make arrangements with your club leader to enter your projects. Contact one of the agents if you have any questions.

Projects may be picked up Sunday, July 20 from 12:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. Each person must arrange to have someone pick up their projects (many club leaders will pick up for the club) or pick them up themselves. In addition, all project books, score sheets, and ribbons should be picked up at this time. Depending on the fair board office, your premium checks may also be available. The Cooperative Extension Service is not responsible for items left at the fair.

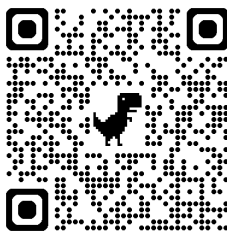

NEW COUNTY FAIR PASS POLICY

The **fair board** will sell passes for entrance into the Kenton County Fair to 4-H members at a cost of \$7.00 each, with a limit of 6 passes per enrolled 4-H'er. These passes do not include rides and are for 4-H youth only and not siblings or parents. They will be available starting Monday, July 7, 2025, at the Kenton County Fairgrounds Office from 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. They will also be available Sunday, July 13, at the 4-H Check-in Booth at the Kenton County Fairgrounds from 1-3 p.m. Checks (payable to Kenton County Fair) or correct change is requested. The Extension Office will not be selling passes this year. Get your passes early at the fair office.

4-H Building Club Display July 15-20

After fair judging is complete, club leaders are encouraged to make a display of their 4-H'ers projects and the club as a whole. These can be set up from noon to 4 p.m. on Monday, July 14.




TRAVELING WITH 4-H MEMBERS

When 4-H members travel with their 4-H leader to an event or activity, 4-H'ers should provide a completed 4-H Event Code of Conduct form, a Participant Information form and the Medical Information form, to the 4-H leader providing transportation. These forms provide information in the event a 4-H member cannot communicate what the 4-H leader needs to know. The forms should be returned to the parent/ guardian after the activity. Forms may be re-used. 4-H Leaders may request copies from the Kenton County Extension Office as needed.



Poultry Culinary Contest - July 26 - Hardin County

There will be three 4-H poultry-related culinary contests on July 26, at the Hardin County Extension office. Registration deadline is July 21 @ 5 PM Eastern Time. Both juniors and seniors can participate in the events.

Egg Chef Challenge will be in the morning. The start time and order of participation will depend on the number of participants and preparation time required for each. Registration for this contest has a second form that must be filled out with the recipe and detailing the time and equipment required to prepare your dish. More info at:

The chicken and turkey BBQ contests will be held concurrently in the afternoon. Anyone participating in the morning, is free to also participate in one of the BBQ contests. At 12:30 PM, the grills and tables will be available for setting up individual workstations and adding charcoal, but no fires can be lit until the start of the contest is indicated, which should be around 1 PM. Awards will be presented when judges have finished the evaluation of all the product submitted at the end of the 2 hour time period. More information found at

Projects You Can Make for the Fair



Cornmeal Muffins



Ingredients or What You Need:

1 egg beaten
1 1/3 cups milk or 1 3/4 cups buttermilk
1/4 cup oil or melted shortening
1 cups self-rising cornmeal mix*

Equipment Needed:

12 cup muffin pan
Cooking spray
Small Bowl
Large mixing bowl
Measuring cups
Spoon for Mixing

For The Fair:

After the muffins cool, place 4 of them on a disposable plate. Place plate in a re-closeable zip-type plastic bag.

Steps/Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 450 degrees F. Spray a 12-cup muffin tin with non-stick spray.
2. In a small bowl, beat the egg slightly.
3. Measure the remaining ingredients and pour them into a large mixing bowl.
4. Add the beaten egg to the large bowl.
5. Mix just enough to blend the ingredients but is still lumpy. (If batter is smooth, it has probably been mixed too much.)
6. Fill the sprayed muffin cup two-thirds full of batter. Do not use paper or foil liners.
7. Bake at 450 degrees F for 15 to 20 minutes or until golden brown.

Nutrition Facts per muffin: 240 calories; 10 g fat, 640 mg sodium, 33 g carbs, 3 g fiber, 5 g protein, 30 mg cholesterol

Baking Tip: *Be sure to read the package to make sure that you are using self-rising cornmeal mix. It is usually packaged in a bag that is similar to that in which flour is sold. Self-rising cornmeal mix has flour and leavening already added. (Boxed corn muffin mix like that made by Jiffy is not the appropriate product to use in this recipe.)



Snickerdoodles



Ingredients:

1 1/2 cups sugar
1 cup butter or margarine, softened
1 teaspoon vanilla
2 eggs
2 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
2 teaspoons cream of tartar
1 teaspoon baking soda
1/4 teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons sugar
2 teaspoons cinnamon

Equipment:

Measuring cups and spoons
Mixing bowls
Cookie sheet
Spatula
Cooling rack

For the Fair:

- After the cookies have completely cooled, choose three cookies that are the same size.
- Place the cookies on a disposable plate.
- Place the plate in a recloseable zip-type plastic bag.

Order of Work:

1. Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F.
2. In a large bowl, cream together sugar, butter, vanilla and eggs.
3. Add flour, cream of tartar, baking soda and salt to creamed mixture; blend well.
4. Combine 2 tablespoons sugar and 2 teaspoons of cinnamon in a small bowl.
5. Shape dough into 1-inch balls.
6. Roll balls in sugar mixture.
7. Place balls 2 inches apart on ungreased cookie sheet.
8. Bake for 8 to 10 minutes or until cookies spring back when lightly touched with the fingers.
9. Use a spatula or turner to remove the hot cookies from the sheet. Place them on a rack to cool. When cool, store cookies in a container with a tight lid.

Nutrition Facts per Cookie: 118 calories, 5 g fat, 97 mg sodium, 16 g carbohydrate, less than 1 g fiber, 1 g protein, 3 mg calcium



Texture Collage



Materials Needed for Rubbing:

Paper
Crayon, Soft-lead or Charcoal Pencil
Glue
Mat Board or Foam Board

Materials Needed for Textured:

Collect various items that have texture
Glue
Mat Board or Foam Board

For the Fair:

A collection of textured items or rubbings of textured items artistically arranged and adhered to mat board or foam core board.

Steps/Directions:

For Rubbing:

1. Place paper over the surface you want to use (i.e. tree bark, brick wall, sidewalks, man-hole covers, textured vinyl floors and other textures surfaces).
2. Use a crayon, soft-lead pencil or charcoal pencil to rub paper until the texture shows through.
3. Try a variety of Colors for added interest.
4. Glue to Mat board or Foam board

For Texture:

1. Collect various items that have interesting textures. You may want to use smooth, nubby fabrics, carpeting, tree bark, leaves, textured cardboard and other items that have texture you can feel. (You can also use textures you can only see like photographs, printed fabric, magazine pictures, etc.)
2. Glue these items onto a mat board or foam board

4-H COUNCIL AGRICULTURE SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarships will potentially be awarded for 2025:

\$1,000 – \$1,500 From the Bi-County Coop Agricultural Resolvment Fund

The following requirements apply to scholarship:

1. Applicants must have a high school graduation date of 2025.
2. Applicant must be a full-time Kentucky resident.
3. Applicant must have been an active Kenton County 4-H member for at least the current and past three (3) years (the current year 2025, 2024, 2023) an active participant in an agricultural related project.

Applicant must attend a post-secondary academic or vocational institution and be a full-time student, consideration given to the program of study.

Application Process:

Applications available at the Kenton County Extension office and on the Kenton County 4-H website at www.kentoncountyextension.org. All applications must be electronically submitted by e-mail to dkelley@uky.edu on or by Thursday, September 4, 2025, in order to be considered. Scholarship winners will be announced and recognized during the Kenton County 4-H Recognition Event in October.


