

#### LIVESTOCK VALIDATION CHECKLIST—2023

- **Exhibitor** orders tags from: https://kystatefair.org/participate/submit-dna/agents/advisors will **NOT** order tags. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to order K.U.I.P. tags.
- **Exhibitor** will pay for tags at checkout. Exhibitor name(s), address, phone number, and email must be completed in order for tags to be shipped. K.U.I.P. tags will be issued to the exhibitor who ordered the K.U.I.P. tag and shall not be sold, traded or otherwise transferred to another exhibitor or animal.
- Entry Office will send tags, DNA kits, and informational paperwork to Exhibitor.
- Exhibitor will follow tagging process to ensure market animal(s) are tagged with a KUIP tag and DNA has been pulled to send back in DNA Envelope.
  - Place 840 EID Tag (KUIP tag) in center of animal's ear. Market Cattle tags are Y-Tex tags, Small Animal tags are AllFlex. Please note this as taggers for these two tags are **NOT** universal.
  - Fill out DNA envelope completely
  - Packets **WILL NOT** be accepted without exhibitor's and parent/guardian signatures
  - Pull 40 hair follicles. **DO NOT CUT HAIR.**
  - Supplies needed: pliers and collection envelope
- Exhibitor will submit **ONLINE** Market Animal Validation Form for each Market Animal. Form can be found at "KY DNA" tab at kystatefair.org/livestock-validation-form/
- **BOTH** the Market Animal Validation Form **AND** the DNA ENVELOPE for **EACH** animal must be submitted or postmarked before posted deadline. (Strongly suggest—hand delivery & obtain receipt or certified mail)
- **EACH** Exhibitor will need to fill out an Online Market Animal Validation Form, even if the exhibitors are co-tagging.

- ♦ March 24, 2023 Market Cattle Validation Form Deadline
- ♦ March 24, 2023 Market Cattle DNA envelopes must be in- hand of the Kentucky State Fair by end of business day 3/24/2023 OR postmarked 3/24/2023. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Send certified mail or deliver and obtain receipt.

#### DURR FOUNDATION 4-H SCHOLARSHIP-KENTON DEADLINE IS MARCH 17, 2023

#### **ELIGIBILITY:**

- Students must be incoming freshmen and must enter one of the following schools: University of Kentucky, Northern Kentucky University, Morehead State University, Thomas More University, Eastern Kentucky University, Western Kentucky University, Gateway Community and Technical College, Maysville Technical and Community College, and Jefferson Community and Technical College.
- Recipients must be high school graduates from a school in one of the following counties and must have been active members in a 4-H program in that county for the last four years: Boone, Bracken, Campbell, Carroll, Gallatin, Grant, Harrison, Kenton, Mason, Owen, Pendleton, or Robertson.
- 3. Applicants must have maintained a 2.5 GPA in their last two years of high school.
- 4. Applicants will submit their high school transcripts.
- 5. Applicants will also submit two letters of recommendation, one from an extension agent and one from a counselor, teacher or principal.
- 6. Applicants will submit on a separate sheet of paper an essay stating why you would like to be the recipient of this scholarship. Include in your essay your interests and/or goals for the future. The essay is limited to two (2) double spaced pages using a 12 point font and one (1) inch margins.
- 7. Student must fill out the application and be willing to appear before a committee for an interview if needed.

Each scholarship is now \$3,000 per year with the scholarship automatically renewing for the student's sophomore year if the student maintains a 2.0 grade point average which would increase the total scholarship value to \$6,000.

You access the application by going to www.DurrFoundation.com, go to the Application page and hit the Apply button at the bottom of the page. Students will need to set up a password with an email address. They will also need the access code: 2023 in order to get the application. Once you hit the submit button, you will no longer be able to edit your application but you may enter data over several sessions until you submit. The State Horse Contests will be June 8 & 9—location to be announced

The Qualification system for the 2023 State Show will be same as for 2022, which is to attend a horse show or horsemanship clinic, and provide proof to your leader/agent.

The Educational hours deadline is May 1.

Horse Eligibility Form deadline is May 15.

Multiple horses can be used in shows. All horses need to qualify and have correct paperwork on file.

## **Kentucky Forest Leadership Program**

Are you interested in the environment and want to know more about forests, trees, insects, water and wildlife? Then consider the Kentucky Forest Leadership Program where you can explore the many aspects of forestry and related fields. If you like hands-on learning in the great outdoors this program is for you. This



week-long, residential program is for high school students completing their sophomore and junior years.

The Kentucky Forest Leadership Program offers three educational tracks:

- <u>Forestry</u> students will learn about tree and plant identification, forest evaluation and management, soil and water quality and fire management in Kentucky's forests.
- <u>Entomology</u> students will learn about insect identification, collection, preservation and ecology. They will also learn about the positive and negative impacts insects can have on Kentucky's forests.
- Wildlife students will gain experience with different techniques to sample, identify and manage wildlife as well as conducting species diversity and population surveys in various Kentucky habitats.
